Historical Enquiry	 Ask and answer questions Use a range of source material including artefacts and stories to find out about the past Identify different ways in which the past is represent Explore events, look at pictures and ask questions i.e, "Which things are old and which are new?" or "What were people doing?" Look at objects from the past and ask questions i.e, "What were they used for?" 					
Historical Terms	 Begin to use terms <i>past</i> and <i>present</i> to describe event Begin to use term such as now, then, a long time ago, yesterday, recently to order events 					
Chronological Understanding	 Describe things that happened to themselves and other people in the past Order a set of events or objects Use a timeline to place important events Know where all people/events studied fit into a chronological framework Sequence events in their life 					
Historical interpretation	 Begin to identify different ways to represent the past (e.g. photos, stories, adults talking about the past Understand that there are different versions of past events e.g. oral accounts about the same event may differ Know that the past is recorded and represented in different ways 					
Continuity and change	 Identify some changes between then and now Know some things that stay the same. Identify how one thing changes over a period of time 					
Cause and consequence	Recognise why people did things, why events happened and what happened as a result					
Similarity and difference	Identify similarities and differences between then and now					
Significance	 Understand what is meant by 'importance' and what makes a person or event important Recognise and make simple observations about who was important in an historical event/ account.
