# Our school day

Registration is between 8.45am and 9am. If your child arrives after 9am they will need to register at the office. If they arrive between 9am and 9.15am they are marked as late and the number of minutes recorded. Arrivals after 9.15am will be marked as 'absent after close of register'.

If you need to report your child's absence, please call the school office on 01872 552648 before 9am. If you need to make a request for planned term time absence e.g. for a hospital appointment, please fill in a green absence request form available from the office. Please note that we are not able to authorise absences unless in very exceptional and significant circumstances.

### **School Travel and Walking Bus**

## Is Your Child Eligible For The Pupil Premium?

If you are in receipt of or eligible for free-school meals your child will receive the Pupil Premium Grant. This is a sum of money paid to the school to use as they feel best to support and enhance your child's education. This grant is paid to the school regardless of whether your child receives a free school meal as part of universal free school meals (YR-Y2)

If you are eligible for the income-based pupil premium you will also be entitled to a 50% discount for trips and camps, funding support for music lessons and wider opportunities. If you think your child may be eligible, please speak to us.
